Throughout this newsletter staff and volunteers have offered useful tips on how to make the most of the Furniture Scheme. We know that despite the Furniture Scheme being 23 years old many people still don't know about all of our services, how to access them and how to help.

Chris Perkins, Community Engagement Worker, and I recently talked to the Doddington Friendship Club (they gave us lots of cake and a donation to the charity) about our work and they couldn't believe the breadth of the Furniture Scheme's work. This isn't the first time we've heard this but we hope that our recent marketing efforts (see page 13) will mean we hear this less and less.

The Furniture Scheme team want to make sure all those people who could benefit from our services are aware of what we do and how they could benefit.

The Enabling Fund

5 years ago we started working with another charity and created an enabling fund. The fund has a strong track record of helping local people to remove financial barriers and gain new skills, leading to sustained employment. To date the Enabling Fund has supported 126 individuals with small grants. Grants have helped pay for driving lessons, work clothes, training, literacy lessons, equipment and much more. The fund is setup to help in people on benefits and low incomes who want to improve their prospects for the future.

This is a local fund and available to people living in the south Shropshire area, specifically Ludlow, Craven Arms, Bishops Castle, Church Stretton and Cleobury Mortimer. To get an application form visit www.furniturescheme.co.uk/events-news/useful-forms

Fuel Poverty Fund

The fund is primarily available to residents of south Shropshire and can be used for gas and/ or electricity.

Applicants must be referred by a local agency, such as Housing Associations, CAB, Churches, a General Practitioner, The Women's Refuge, Social Workers, Children in Need. The fund can only be accessed by the same household/person twice in one year and we must receive the receipts as proof of payment.

Emergency Furniture Referral

Our partner agencies can refer individuals and families, who are lacking basic furniture for their homes, to the Furniture Scheme and for £40 we can provide a range of items including kitchen equipment, linen and essential furniture. The recipient cannot choose their own items. To get an emergency pack the referral MUST come from an agency who can testify to the recipient's need. What furniture and household items can we accept?

We can only accept goods that are in a good quality condition, suitable for reuse. Unfortunately we are no longer able to accept large TVs, only flat screen TVs.

If you are donating sofas, armchairs, mattresses or divan beds they must have the fire safety label attached. They're usually attached to your sofa behind the cushions. If these items do not have one, unfortunately we cannot accept it.

For a full list of what we will accept please see page 8. We now also take clothes that are in good condition.

What happens to donated furniture?



Furniture is either booked in for the van crew to collect, or the customer sometimes drops it off to the warehouse directly.

The items are then put into our storage area to be either transferred into the shop area when there is available space, or to be tested if they are electrical items.

Suitable items are then sold to the public at low cost, helping those on a low income to furnish their property.

Anyone in receipt of Universal Credit, Tax Credit, Pension Credit, Income Support, Job Seekers Allowance, Employment Support Allowance, or Housing Benefit can claim a further 25% discount with any proof of the benefit that they are claiming. This discount only applies to items we have received via donation not those we have purchased.

Those in severe need can be referred to us by a partner agency for a £40 referral pack.

Some furniture goes to our workshop where staff and volunteers restore and upcycle it before it goes on sale at Renaissance. With the money raised from donated items, or items bought in our shops we are able to improve people's life chances, strengthen communities, increased environmental sustainability and to help make a difference.

What if an item is not fit for re-use?

We recycle wood, metal, textiles, small electricals, cardboard and books. It is very rare that we have to take anything to the Household Recycling Centre. Every year we divert around 200 tonnes from landfill.

Can anyone buy from the Warehouse?

Yes! We are open to the public 6 days a week.

Open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday 9:30am-3:30pm, Wednesdays 9:30am – 1:30pm and Saturdays 10am-2pm.



Renaissance

Quite often at Renaissance we are surprised by the quality of furniture that comes in. To think that someone would be kind enough to donate such interesting and unique pieces in support of our charity is incredible.

We sometimes hear from customers that they didn't know that we were here, and often how surprised they are by our diverse stock. These customers often remark that they thought we were a high priced antique shop from the outside but are then gobsmacked by our affordable prices.

So, how can customers get the best out of Renaissance?

- Visit regularly. We change our stock at least once a week.
- If you want adjustments or alterations made to the furniture, be sure to ask. We are often able to help.
- If you see an item that you really want, don't hesitate.
 We often hear disappointed customers remark that they should have acted sooner and now the one of a kind item has sold.

Carpentry Workshop

Interview with Terry, a volunteer at our Workshop

How long have you been volunteering at the Furniture Scheme?

It has got to be about 5 years now. When I first joined Bob was in charge of the workshop. I only came in for half a day a week to start with – next thing I know I'm doing 4 days a week!

Before you started volunteering what were you doing?

I had retired and was mainly at home reading, doing jigsaws and that kind of thing. The wife said 'why don't you go and volunteer' so I did.

What sort of things do you help with in the workshop?

A bit of stripping furniture, sanding and polishing but mainly painting. The first thing Bob had me do was paint a bookcase – I'd done it before he could blink. He said 'You've done that before!'. I said 'yeah, only for the last 50 years!'. I've been a painter and decorator all my life you see.

What do you enjoy about volunteering?

You have a good craic with the other volunteers and I like upsetting the gaffer! If I wasn't doing this I'd be bored stiff. I also like helping the charity. There are all ages here, it's like a little community. We take the mick out of each other but we support each other too.

Do you have any tips for people who want to paint furniture?

If it's in an a bad state, strip it, rub it down, coat of primer, 2 coats of finish. I'm not into chalk paint – I'd rather do a traditional 'proper' job. Some people like it quick but not me. When you're applying the final coat, get your layering right. Up and down, then side to side and then up and down again. Don't flood the brush.






Manor Adventure Day
